

1. CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT

We have intervened in areas of providing assistance for education & Training.



a. SCHOLARSHIP & SPONSORSHIPS

We have supported in payment of fees, assisted in placement of young people into training and provided school training materials. A total of 33 people (17 females and 16 males) were assisted for tertiary education (3 females), TVET (6 females, 2 males), short-term professional courses (7 females, 14 males) and apprenticeship (1 female).

b. High Level Political Forum (HLPF) 2019

We have participated and promoted the participation of young people in the HLPF 2019 in New York. With Don Bosco Youth Network West Africa, Salesians of Don Bosco AFW province and Salesian Missions Inc., 2 representatives from Ghana attended the event in New York. Ms Abigail Fosuaa Gyabaa was a panellist at a side event on Climate action. Benson Osei-Savio Boateng was a panellist at a side event and spoke on 'Addressing Inclusions, Inequality and Institutions' present on best practices in SDG8 through the lens of Leave No One Behind.

c. Staff Training

7 staff members have received various professional short-term training programmes from professional mediation to Tax laws. The training was meant to develop the capacities of the staff to enhance service to the young by the young.

2. GREEN ECONOMY

We have engaged in promoting training and measures that promotes sustainable ecology.







a. New Training in Agriculture

In our 'New Training in Agriculture' campaign, we are promoting sustainable, green and innovative Agriculture for Youth and Women. **84 trainees** graduated. We are carrying out the training with strong involvement of the private sector as we promote competence-based training. The training focuses on crop production (organic), management, business planning and Marketing.





b. TOT in Bio-entomology

During the year, a training of 30 farmers and Agric officers from 4 districts of the Bono and Bono East Regions was carried out. The beneficiaries were DBTI agricultural teachers (4), local assemblies' agricultural officers (11), Ministry of Food and Agriculture (MoFA) officers (5) and mentor farmers (10). It was an activity of the LEEVYW project led by VIS and financed by the EU. The training was on Greenhouse farming and Bio-Entomology. The participants received the training in 2 workshops.

c. Global Week of Action on SDGs 2019

We participated actively in the 2019 Global Week of Action on SDGs 20 – 27 September 2019. We participated in the Global Climate strike, awareness raising in schools and markets, Press Conference and clean-up exercise.




3. YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

We have promoted the empowerment of young people to enhance livelihood and independence.








a. VNR 2019

The Voluntary National Review on the SDGs presented the opportunities for us to promote active youth engagement in the process and to ensure the voices of the youth are heard. We promoted youth participation in the drafting and review process. At the National Review of the report at the International conference centre, we were actively present with 2 representatives.





b. World Bank Group Youth Summit December 2019

We were happy to promote the participation of Mr Philip Agyei in the Summit after his application was selected among over 3,000 applicants. Together with our partners, we were delighted about the successful participation in the summit and saw it as means to promote deprived young people's voice in international issues of common concern. Mr Philip Agyei acquitted himself in the preliminary stages and was successful to attend the summit with the themes 'Smarter Cities for a Resilient Future' held at World Bank group Headquarters at Washington DC. on December 2 – 3, 2019.

c. Assistance to Youth Entrepreneurship

Promoting youth entrepreneurship is a great way to empower young people to be self-reliant and mitigate irregular and risky migration. Within the year, we supported 25 young people in forming and creating their businesses in honey farming (Sunyani), vegetable farms (Berekum, Buoyam and Kranka), electrical enterprises (Tema and Sunyani) and hair dressing (Berekum).




4. AGRICULTURE & RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Our activities to promote agricultural and rural development had social, business and human development focus.









a. Mentorship farming

To motivate youth in sustainable, green and profitable agriculture in the sub-region is a herculean task we are working assiduously on. We are currently on course to support and accompany 5 young people to be entrepreneurial youth farmers in Nkoranza North (Kranka), Sunyani, Nsuatre, Berekum and Dormaa. In the year under review 5 mentorship farms have been supported at Berekum (Amomaso), Senase (Nafa Nkwanta), Sunyani (Yawhima), Kranka and Nsuatre (Amanfoso).













b. Accessible clean/portable water Ghana

We have invested immensely through our donors by improving access to clean and portable drinking water in some deprived communities in parts of the Bono, Volta and Northern Regions. 7 boreholes (3 hand-pump, 3 mechanized and 1 solar mechanized) were provided at Tailakrom, Kpassack, Alavanyo, and Tatale areas.



5. GENDER & SOCIAL INCLUSION

Promoting social inclusion and gender is one of our cardinal pillars. We seek to provide relief for those in distress and support gender in special disadvantage situation.









a. Emergency/Relief support

During the year, we provided emergency assistance after fire outbreak at Berekum for a Saloon and delivered emergency assistance to certain individuals in Tema and Ashaiman. We assisted 7 persons in different emergency situations. All were women.

b. Medical support

We have provided financial and medical aid to some individuals within the year. 6 individuals (4 females and 2 males) received health support. Also, 2 centres in Ashaiman and Tatale received medical aid.

c. Single mother assistance

We are supporting 4 single mothers' situations in terms of accommodation (rent), fees for children, and support for shop space. They are located in Madina, Ashaiman and Sunyani.




